

Admission Requirements of Wu Yee Sun Term-long Exchange Programme (2020/21)

Important Notes

1. Cumulative GPA (CGPA)

- Students must have a cumulative GPA 2.70 or above **AND** fulfill the CGPA requirement specified by the host institution.
- GPA for the 1st term of the current academic year must be counted.

2. Year of Undergraduate Study

Be aware that some programmes require students to have at least completed Year 2 or Year 3 before going on exchange.

3. Eligible for Final Year Students

Pay attention that some programmes are not eligible for final year students whose expected graduation date is 31 July 2020.

4. Non-English Language Proficiency

- The minimum level of proficiency which the selected students must have at the time of application is a level just lower than the requirement specified, if there are any. (e.g. if intermediate level is required, students must have elementary level at the time of application, i.e. about 150-200 learning hours or currently enrolled in a Language IV course at CUHK.) By the time the students participate in the exchange programmes, they should fulfill the specified requirement.

By the time you participate in the exchange programme, you should have completed:

- at least 200 hours = A2
- at least 300 hours = B1
- at least 500 hours = B2
- at least 700 hours = C1
- at least 1000 hours = C2

*If you have any doubt on your current level, please consult your language teacher. OAL will not certify your language proficiency.

5. Minimum TOEFL/IELTS scores

- For programmes marked with a #, students must apply with a valid TOEFL/IELTS score (including overall score and sub-scores, if applicable) which meets the requirements specified. Otherwise, they will NOT be considered as eligible applicants for the programmes.
- Only scores from tests taken on or after 1 September 2018 are considered valid.
- Students are required to provide their TOEFL/IELTS score report. Their full name, test date and scores must be clearly shown on the report.

6. Remarks

- If a programme has major/discipline requirements, please check if you can meet the requirements, e.g. if a programme only accepts students in Business or Economics major, please do not apply if you are in another discipline.
- Pay attention to the remarks (e.g. for local students only or not open to Singaporean and Malaysian citizens etc).

7. Available Discipline

Courses offered by host institutions may or may not be open to CUHK students.

8. Final Year Students

- Students who have an expected graduation date of 31 July 2020 in CUSIS record are categorized as final year students.
- Final year students who are shortlisted must seek their major Department's pre-approval for extension of study period at CUHK by completing the "Indication of Intention to Extend Study Period Form", and submit to College by 5:30pm on 13 Dec.
- Final year students cannot select 2nd term programmes under any circumstances.
- If a final year student is applying for both exchange programmes offered by Colleges and OAL, he or she is required to obtain two "Indication of Intention to Extend Study Period" form from the College and OAL separately, and return the completed form to the respective offices by 13 December 2019.

9. Maximum Cumulative Period of Exchange

During the entire study period at CUHK, each student can go on exchange for a maximum of one academic year, i.e. two regular academic terms plus one u-wide summer exchange.

10. Minimum Course Load Requirement During Exchange (Undergraduates)

- If students are in the new curriculum, they must enroll in a minimum of 9 units, and obtain passing grades in at least 6 units of courses per term (except summer term).
- If students are in the old curriculum, they must enroll in a minimum of 12 units and obtain passing grades in at least 9 units of courses per term (except summer term).
- Failure to do so could make it hard for students to graduate or cause 100% repayment of any financial support.
